## What is it?



- A cross-country research project for mutual learning on Housing First implementation
- It assesses the fidelity of a HF program to the core principles of the original HF model (Pathways to Housing)
- It analyses the different adaptations of the HF model to the different contexts

## Housing First is a ground-breaking model

- Shakes mindsets
- Questions existing intervention models
- That always scares and generates reluctances

## Development of HF at international level

- Early introduction stage in many countries
- Different countries = different policy, social & health services contexts
- Many different organizations will implement HF programs

## HF is born as an evidence based practice

- Evaluation shows programs deliver results on expected outcomes
- We need to know what are we evaluating





 Go through other identified issues relevant to the program success or needed from improvement
